



ST JOHN BOSCO

At a very young age, John Bosco knew God called him to serve youth. When he was just nine years old, he was inspired by a dream that would change his life forever. He saw a multitude of very poor boys who were fighting and cursing amongst each other. Suddenly a man of majestic appearance emerged and told him: "With meekness and charity, you will conquer these your friends." Ever since that dream, he knew it was his destiny to become a priest and would dedicate himself to assist the poor youth. John Bosco was 26 years old when he was ordained to the priesthood in Turin. He would now be called Don Bosco and would come to celebrate his first mass in the church of St. Francis of Assisi. He came to the rescue of the youth and worked with orphan boys that would roam the streets of Turin or would come to him for shelter.

In 1854, speaking to the group of young people with whom he founded a religious congregation, Don Bosco said: "Our Lady wants us to found a Society. I have decided that we will call ourselves Salesians".

Common Mistakes made by Catholics pertaining to the Mass.

- 1. <u>Seeking a blessing immediately after Mass</u>. It is not appropriate for anyone who has just attended Mass, to seek a blessing from the priest who has just pronounced the blessing at the Concluding Rite, at the end of Mass. To do so makes a mockery of what has just been celebrated. No priest, no matter how pastorally motivated, can confer a greater blessing than the one just received.
- 2. <u>Making the sign of the Cross repeatedly</u>. Making the sign of the cross repeatedly, is not illicit, but it is inappropriate. The sign of the cross should be made at the start and at the end of Mass, and only at other times when appropriate to do so.
- 3. <u>Genuflecting with the left knee</u>. If you are unable to genuflect with your right knee, a bow is the more appropriate action to take. During Jesus' Passion, the Roman soldiers deliberately knelt on their left knee in mockery of Jesus. When Catholics genuflect on their right knee it is done so as a sign of respect and humility.
- 4. Exiting the church. It is inappropriate for people to exit the church before the presiding priest or minister has done so, and whilst chatting to others. Members of the congregation should wait for the priest to completely recess out before following suit and reserve all chatter until they are in the foyer or outside.
- 5. <u>Wearing inappropriate attire</u>. People attending Mass should only wear clothes of a respectful nature. Mini skirts and t-shirts with inappropriate slogans or words are not acceptable.
- 6. <u>Talking/chatting during Mass</u>. People should fully engage in all the Mass prayers and responses but should leave all other chatter until after Mass has concluded. It is always appropriate however, for parents to instruct their children in the ways of the faith, even during Mass.
- 7. <u>Arriving late</u>. Since there is no greater celebration we can possibly participate in than the celebration of the Eucharist, where Jesus Christ becomes truly present, we should do our utmost to offer the greatest respect we can and arrive on time.

The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35 I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's

affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

GOSPEL: Mark 1: 21-28

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
